Sermon Notes
“Words to the Wise”
Romans 12:9-21

When Paul wrote his letters to the first century churches, he always ended them with some practical suggestions as to how God’s people might live and work together more effectively and harmoniously. As I conclude my ministry with you here at Calvary, I want to follow in his footsteps. That’s why I have chosen a passage of Scripture from the book of Romans for this Sunday’s sermon. Follow along with me as we discover some words to the wise.

Welcome
